What's YOUR Favorite? (continued)

Primal form of communication

- links to ancient traditions, legends, archetypes, myths, and symbols
- connect us to a larger self and universal truths

About collaboration and connection

- engage us through emotions, and they connect us to others
- share passions, sadness, hardships and joys, meaning and purpose.
- common ground that allows people to communicate, overcoming our defenses and our differences.

How we make meaning of life.

- schemas, scripts, mental models, metaphors, or narratives
- how we explain how things work, how we persuade others, how we understand our place in the world
- create our identities, and define and teach social values

Provide order

- Humans seek certainty, and story structure is predictable, comforting
- We can withstand intense emotions because we know resolution follows the conflict.

Stories create genuine emotions, presence

- Stories take place in the imagination, in the human brain
- Imagined experiences are processed the same as real experiences.

Through imagination we tap into creativity and empathy for others

- We become participants in narrative, step out of our own shoes and see differently
- schemas, scripts, mental models, metaphors, or narratives
- Foundation for innovation, selfdiscovery, and change
